Round Table / *Table ronde* : **Building Healthy Societies: Epidemic Control and Prevention / Construire des sociétés en bonne santé : prévention et lutte contre les épidémies**

Putting in place cutting edge public health systems and ensuring healthy societies are widely recognized as key to Africa reaping a dividend from its youth bulge in the years to come. The Ebola Virus Disease epidemic in the Mano River Basin has instigated questions that are vital to the project of working toward an Africa characterized by healthy people. Round Table / *Table ronde* : **Understanding and Transcending Fundamentalisms / Comprendre et aller au-delà des fondamentalismes**

Often characterized by exclusionary visions and absolutist fervor, religious fundamentalism has increasingly become the subject of much debate in Africa and the rest of the world. For Africa the onslaught of various religious fundamentalist groups in the early 21st Century only represent another layer in a long history of confrontations with various absolutist visions that include colonial 'civilization' schemes, structural economic reforms, political reform agendas and social schemes. One thing that all of these schemes have had in common is the little credence they give to allowing African communities most affected by policies enough space to debate and make informed choices. The panel will take on the causes, nature and multidimensional effects of various fundamentalist schemes. It will also explore interactions between the schemes and wider social processes and the possibilities for building more open and less absolutist futures in Africa.
